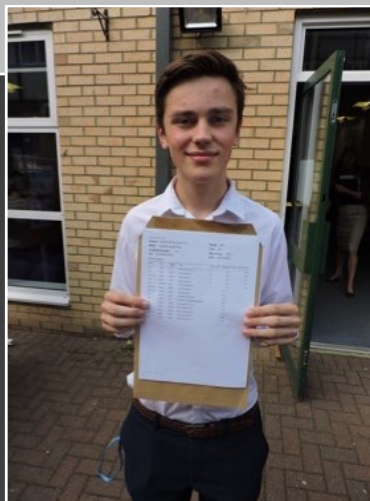
These results don't include grades for General Studies and /or The A level Extended Project Qualification which many of the students above also scored highly in.

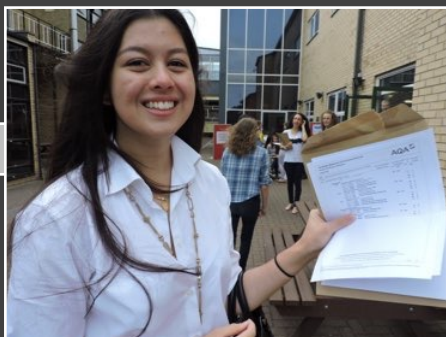
