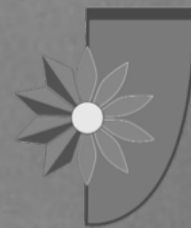


GCSE EXAM RESULTS 2015

Congratulations to our Year 11 students who collected their GCSE results on Thursday.

This year's students have done particularly well producing some of the school's best ever results across almost all subjects.

Headlines include:

61% of all grades at A or A* (up 11% on last year)

Every student in the year achieved at least 5 GCSEs at grades A*-C

97% of the year group achieved 5A*-C including English and Maths

89% achieved the Government's tough EBACC measure: passes in at least 5 specified academic subjects at grades A*-C.

As well as thanking the dedicated teaching staff I would also like to thank Mrs J Pankhurst (Head of Year 11) the academic mentoring team and the committed Year 11 tutors who have all made a significant difference to the chances, aspirations and successes of the students in their charge.
