C.A.T. Tests

This week all year 7 pupils have sat some short Cognitive Ability Tests not dissimilar to ones they undertook in the 11 plus tests. Many schools ask pupils to sit these right at the start of the year because they provide information which helps teachers understand pupils' particular strengths and areas of aptitude, as well as providing information on preferred learning styles. We spend some time as a staff looking at what the tests tell us, as well as balancing that information about what we are learning about your daughter's skills and strengths in class work.

We have been sure to stress with all of Year 7 that these are quick tests which they can't prepare for and are simply to provide teachers with a bit of baseline information about them so we can get to know about their strengths as quickly as possible.

Because the tests are nationally benchmarked using a large, annually reviewed data set they also provide some estimates of your child's likely academic progress over the next five years up to GCSE level. They are just one piece of information we then use to set targets for your child which we again share with you via our reporting systems. We will be sharing the information about your daughter provided by these tests with you in the next few weeks.
