

## LANGUAGE JOURNALISM EVENT – SCOOP

On the 13th March the school hosted SCOOP!, a language journalism event run by Business Language Champions aiming to promote language skills and careers in journalism.

Teams of sixth formers from several local schools took part, including two Year 12 teams from the Joint Sixth Form.

The day started with a speech by sports journalist Simon Hart on how languages benefit his career.

Each team was then tasked with researching, designing and writing a newspaper front page in French, German or Spanish, which involved several activities such as conducting interviews and negotiating advertisement space, all using the target language.

After presenting their newspapers in the target language to Simon Hart, he announced the event's winners, including the Joint Sixth Form's French team as runners-up.

All the teams found the event an insightful hands-on experience of journalism and felt that the various tasks had encouraged their confidence using languages, an essential skill for their A-Level language studies.

#### UKMT Maths Competition 2017

On Monday 13th March, Abby Couchman (9KG), Hannah Speight (8W), Phoebe Loach-Martin (8F) and I travelled to The Priory Academy LSST to take part in the UKMT Maths competition. The UKMT Team Challenges involve teamwork and communication skills, and give pupils the opportunity to compete against pupils from other schools in their region.

We had four challenges over the day to complete. The first was a group round, where we had ten challenging questions to complete in a given time. Each team had to work together to solve each problem, some harder than others.

Next, we had to split into pairs and were given a crossnumber challenge. It was a puzzle set out like a crossword, but instead we had to fill the grid with numbers. Each pair had a

different set of questions, and some relied on the answers from the other pair – we could not talk to each other but had to communicate by asking the teacher supervising us to talk to our opposite pair, making the challenge even more difficult.

Then we underwent a shuttle round where we had 8 minutes to answer four difficult questions, in pairs again, which relied on the answer from the previous question. This was repeated 4 times, and meant in each shuttle we had to be very accurate with our answers to get as many points as possible. If we finished within 6 minutes, we could gain 3 extra bonus points.

The relay round was last. We were again split into pairs and moved away from each other. Pair A had to quickly run to the teacher supervising them, collect their question and then answer it back at their table as quickly as possible. We had one chance to get the question right if

we got it wrong first time, and once we had got the question right or used our chances we had to deliver the next question to Pair B, which involved a lot of running around and turned the room into chaos.

Overall, the team from KSHS did well by coming 9th out of 23 schools, with LSST winning out of all of the schools who competed. Thank you to Mrs Green for making the trip possible

and giving us an opportunity to take part in the competition, as well as LSST for holding the event.


#### REQUESTS FOR ABSENCE IN SCHOOL TIME


