### New Locker Solution at KSHS Next Academic Year

From September 2017 onwards an independent company I.L.S. will be providing lockers for Kesteven & Sleaford High School for students in Years 7-11. This new solution will enable the school to replace all the existing old, small lockers which have come to the end of their working life.

The brand new lockers are owned by I.L.S. and are available for students to rent for a fee on an annual basis. The scheme is already used by schools across the country including schools in Lincolnshire: members of the KSHS student council visited one of them earlier in the year to see the scheme in action and have played their part in recommending its use.

Existing school lockers which are still in a good state of repair will be made available to sixth formers free of charge in the sixth form areas, in recognition of the fact that sixth formers are expected to travel between school sites more regularly.

Please look out for a letter that will be sent to all Year 7-10 parents in the next week or so, as well as to parents of students starting with us in Year 7 in September via the school admission packs.

The film is described as "an energetic and honest coming-of-age drama about a teenager's new friendship with a group of girls in the suburbs of Paris." The film was definitely full of tension and dealt with gritty issues such as difficult family relationships. Film study is a key part of French at A Level and it was also a great opportunity for the students to build their language skills in an enjoyable way.

Mia Franklin (13F) said "I found the film very useful for listening purposes as I struggle with the listening exam the most, and I feel that I really benefited from hearing the French language at such a fast pace with their really strong accents. (The subtitles also came in

handy!) I enjoyed the film a lot but found the ending was a bit naff!"

Libby Beckett (13L) said "It was really useful to see a modern French film to compare with the older one we're studying. I thought the film was really interesting, as it had a different perspective to other films about life in the Paris suburbs, being about girls, friendship etc, and it was helpful for our listening skills and cultural awareness of another part of French society that we don't often encounter in class!"

#### Shona McCallin, Olympic Hockey Player visits KSHS

From the English U16's, U18's and, ultimately, as the captain of the England and GB U21's, Shona McCallin developed a reputation for being a driving force in the midfield. Scoring 13 goals and multiple medals along the way, Shona's success included leading England's Hockey team to its highest-ever finish at the Junior World Cup in 2013. Simultaneously, she attended Tilburg University and trained in Holland at MOP HC under the leadership of coach Toon Siepman. It was during this time that

Shona honed her game among the world's best.

McCallin is now a senior level international.

She lives and trains full-time with the English national team just outside of London. She achieved her 50th combined international appearance for Great Britain and England during the Rio Olympic Final, a historic night for Great Britain Hockey. The team created history and won Great Britain's first ever Olympic Gold medal in women's hockey with over 9 million people watching on BBC 1.
