


Judging took place on the Friday evening where entrants and their parents and teachers were invited to view the exhibition in the Roof Gallery. The competition was very strong with a range of beautifully executed products made from a range of materials across all areas of Design and Technology.

The judges awarded Year 13 A Level Textile student Freya Hide the award for 'Artistic Excellence', they were very impressed with the development, execution and sustainable ideas behind her evening dress. Inspired by Emma Watson's Met Gala outfit promoting #30 wears, Freya designed a dress that could be adapted to a short dress by detaching the sheer lower skirt, and could be worn with a pin-tucked shrug. She chose sustainable materials, organic bamboo silk, organic cotton, silk dupion and recycled polyester fabrics to create her evening dress which featured hand and machine embroidery reflecting the theme of 'under the microscope'.

Not to be outdone by Year 12 several students participated in the national 'Take your Sons and Daughters to Work Day' earlier in the year. Lucy Gibbons and Lauren Gamble (9KG) share their experience:



Take your Sons and Daughters to Work Day

On Thursday 27th April, we went to BAE Systems at RAF Coningsby to experience a day in the lives of our parents at work.

There were six students and their parents who work at BAE Systems and we were introduced to the other people by playing an ice-breaker game which involved giving everybody alliterative nicknames. We then had a talk about careers both generally and in BAE Systems and we found out about how S.T.E.M. (Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths) subjects could link to a lot of careers. We also found out about the different ways to get into a career such as apprenticeships and university.

We were given a tour of the TMF (Typhoon Maintenance Facility) and had our pictures taken in front of an RAF Typhoon. We then spent our lunch time with our parents. During lunch, we were given the opportunity to have a go on the RAF Typhoon simulator.

After our lunch break, we were given a tour of the whole TTF (Typhoon Training Facility) and found out about how the RAF pilots train to fly Typhoons and the difference between flying in the simulator compared to the aeroplane. We then were told about the weapons used on the aircraft and how they have advanced through time.

After that, we were given a project management challenge. We had to plan the steps to make a cup of tea. We were given post-it notes and had to write on them the steps of making tea in order to work out how to make the quickest cup of tea. We were then given an imaginary budget and had to plan a holiday for a celebrity and a friend. We had to plan every step of the holiday such as picking up the passport and booking a flight. After these exercises, we had a talk on project management.

To finish the day, we wrote down on post-it notes what we liked about the day, what we didn't really like and what we were confused about. We then stuck the post-it notes on pieces of paper to help BAE Systems improve future days like this. We were then given a bag of goodies and a certificate.

Phase 2 – Skills

Phase 3 – Make a difference (local community project)

Following the completion of all 3 phases, students will graduate from the programme with a certificate as confirmation of their achievement and commitment.




