Robert Carre Trust Trip to Zanzibar from Friday 21st July to Friday 5th August 2017

23 students from the sixth form of Kesteven and Sleaford High School and Carre's Grammar School left Heathrow bound for Zanzibar, via Doha, on the first Friday of the school holidays. Bright sunshine and a warm welcome from the tour company's local staff greeted us on arrival.



Our days were packed with snorkelling trips to the local reefs around the islands off the coast of Zanzibar, as well as visiting local businesses, development initiatives and tourist attractions.

One group grew seaweed and used it to make soap and body scrubs to sell to visitors, whilst another used recycled materials to generate art work and crafts.

We had opportunities not only to observe the rich variety of sea life under water, along with dolphins, but also the endemic Red Colobus monkeys and a range of butterflies from the local forest. The importance of the mangrove forests and marine conservation was explained to the group in addition to them learning something of the history and culture of the island.





Our Swahili lessons were put to good use as we moved around the island and were especially helpful when shopping.

During the last 3 days the students volunteered at the Creative Solutions community centre giving them the chance to help to teach the pre–school classes in the afternoons and make handicrafts, recycled art and do service projects in the morning.

It was an unforgettable experience and the students took away so much from their visit.



Growth Mindset – Recognising the Positive Learning Attitudes of our Students

Our staff training and development sessions are designed to engage staff in the latest pedagogical research. For the past 2 years we have considered, amongst other topics, how the credible and thought provoking research on 'Growth Mindsets' can influence learners of all ages and abilities, in all subject areas at the High School. Last year we were lucky enough to work with Jackie Beere OBE and since then we have spent time as a staff discussing how we translate theory into practice across the school.

What we have learnt has informed assemblies for students; shaped the language we use as teachers in our feedback to students, both verbal and written and influenced the way we support students in and out of the classroom when concepts aren't easy to grasp first time.

This year our emphasis is on raising students' awareness of just how powerful it can be to have a Growth Mindset. As part of our focus we are launching a new initiative to add to the many ways we publically celebrate student success. In addition to the awarding of house points, praise letters home, twice yearly



awarded subject badges and Headteacher awards, students in every year group can now be nominated by staff for demonstrating a growth mindset. Nominations will be made every two weeks with every member of staff able to nominate a student of their choice who has especially impressed them by demonstrating a growth mindset. Nominations will be listed in the bi-monthly newsletter for parents and friends of the school to see and every student nominated will be entered into a monthly draw to receive a $\pounds 10$ Amazon voucher.

We look forward to sharing with you the first nominations in the next edition of the newsletter.

School Uniform

Returning to School with a Fracture

Before returning to school, parents of students with a confirmed fracture need to liaise with the school's First Aiders or SEN team to complete a form which details the injury and any special arrangements that need to be made. Any hospital documentation (or copy of) should also be brought in.

All students that have a confirmed fracture that is not supported by a full cast are at risk of further injury by being in school. These students are advised not to attend school until they have had a follow up appointment and a full cast is applied. Exceptions to this are upper arm/shoulders which do not require immobilising with a full cast, fingers, toes and small bone fractures of the hand or foot.

International School Award Accreditation
