

Year 10 Stitch History into Textiles



On Thursday 28th September the Year 10 GCSE Textiles group spent the day at the National Centre for Craft and Design in Sleaford taking part in a workshop with Nigel Cheney which was linked to his exhibition.


The students were given a tour of Nigel Cheney's exhibition which was based upon family memories from the First and Second World Wars. Old photographs from his family were combined with textural hand and machine embroidery, old uniforms, digital and screen printed motifs of medals and serial numbers. Students learned a range of basic hand embroidery stitches which they then experimented with to create coloured 'medal ribbons'.




A tour of the 'Dressing Up Box' fashion and accessory exhibition and a fashion drawing exercise concluded the morning session. After lunch the students worked on digital printed medal motifs, making their own medals and creating collages. There was then a 'show and tell' before returning to school.




