Dear Parents/Guardians,

This week in assemblies we have shared the latest research and advice from the Medical Commissioner, which you may have seen on various news platforms, regarding appropriate levels of use of mobile phones by young people. We already have tight rules in school about where and when young people can use their mobile phones and after the half term break this will include the fact that mobile phones will not be permitted in the school dining areas at break and lunch. We ask parents to play their part in supporting our attempts to educate young people regarding phone use. Last term staff spent one afternoon counselling a student whose parent had phoned her daughter at lunchtime to relay upsetting news of a family member's terminal illness. This was clearly not in the best interests of the student. Whilst this is an extreme example we hope that parents realise that the school office is available to liaise between you and your child in any emergency but that contacting your child by mobile phone during the day distracts them from their learning and can cause confusion and upset.

There is no doubt that mobile phones are also, on occasion, a useful learning resource in lessons, however we discourage our students from bringing them to school and draw your attention to the KSHS mobile phone policy we have had in place since the start of the academic year regarding their use and confiscation. Please do take this opportunity to familiarise yourself with the policy which takes due regard for student safety but applies a common sense approach to student wellbeing at school day to day.
