Library News

Reading to educate, understand and develop empathy



This year marks the 75th Anniversary of the liberation of Auschwitz Birkenau, and with this in mind the student Library Captains have been busy curating a collection to commemorate Holocaust Memorial Day. Students have sourced a range of fiction and non-fiction that has formed a poignant display to browse or borrow from.

Harrowing subjects can be better understood through reading, with fiction particularly creating greater levels of empathy. Students' learning experiences are enhanced by reading a book, and in our complicated world reading fiction can introduce a student to situations and characters in a more relatable and manageable way; the reader is afforded the luxury of knowing that none of what they are reading is happening directly to them, and although transported to an upsetting situation they may retreat at any time.

The boy in the striped pyjamas by John Boyne is a hugely popular book – aimed at 11-16-year-old readers, it was first published in 2006 and is still regularly borrowed from the KSHS Library. Biographies are also a useful way of learning, and

the diary of a young girl - Ann Frank's unique testimonial, remains one of the most popular and powerful books of all time. Incidentally, it is the most borrowed book in the KSHS Library to date. More recently the Tattooist of Auschwitz by Heather Morris has become an international bestseller, and is a new addition to the school Library.

Having access to a collection of books that reflect the world that we live in is an essential component in helping to educate our students. Testimonies from survivors of the Holocaust remind us all never to forget but to continue to share the truth and educate younger generations so that such atrocities may never be repeated. A good read is not always a comfortable read, but if we learn from the pages we delve into, a read will never be wasted.
