#### **English Scheme of Learning**

Year 10 - Term 5 + 6 Poetry Anthology and Speaking and Listening

#### Intent - Rationale

Poetry Anthology and Speaking and Listening. The AQA GCSE Poetry anthology Love and Relationships forms the basis of study for Terms 5 and 6. Students will be encouraged to meet each poem in an 'unseen' manner and then develop their own interpretation of the poem. Developing a personal response for each of the poems will help facilitate each student's recall for the closed book exam. As the study develops, comparisons across the Anthology will be encouraged. Organisation of annotated poems and revision materials will also be emphasised as the students transition to their final year of study. Teachers are directed to the advice from AQA to begin essays with a overview – or big picture statement – that clarifies their interpretation and comparative focus.
