Dear Parent/Carer

Today we have received news of a confirmed positive test for Covid-19 for a Year 8 student who was last in school on Friday 11 September and began feeling unwell that evening. We have been alerted to this today.

The school has been in contact with Public Health England. As a result, all Year 8 students are to self-isolate for 7 days with immediate effect. The school will re-open to Year 8 students on Monday 28 September. This is because students should isolate for 14 days after contact with a student displaying symptoms.

We are confident that Year 8 students have remained in their 'bubble' since the start of term and only had passing contact with other students in all other year groups around the school site. The student has no other siblings in any other secondary school in the town and does not travel to school by bus.

All students and staff in school next week will be expected to wear a face covering in corridors and communal areas inside the school buildings. Please supply a face mask or visor and a plastic bag that your child can store this in during lessons.

What to do if your child develops symptoms of COVID-19

If your child develops symptoms of COVID-19, they must not come to school and should remain at home for at least **10 days** from the date when their symptoms appeared. Anyone with symptoms will be eligible for testing and this can be arranged via <https://www.nhs.uk/ask-for-a-coronavirus-test> or by calling 119.
